## An I-Spy trail from Arundel Museum



From bootmakers and bankers to artists and engineers, Arundel has been home to many talented people and trades over the years. **Can you spot clues to Arundel's ancestors as you explore the town?**

1

Start your journey outside the museum doors - can you find an anniversary celebrated on the museum wall? **The person who helped us celebrate is one of our neighbours but where does he officially live?**

Next to the museum are the ruins of a different type of home. **Who lived here and what did they do in the town?**

Walk on from the ruins until you get to the Queen's Street bridge. Over the years, this bridge has been rebuilt many times. Two men helped build this current version. **What were their names and what was their job?**



**Can you work out when the latest bridge was built?**

Walk back across the bridge towards the town and turn left at the roundabout and walk along the High Street. Follow the road round, past the Swan Hotel, and cross the road to investigate the war memorial.

**Can you find the surname of the four brothers who all died during the First World War?** There was a fifth brother called Philip who was too young to fight in the First World War. There is a memorial to all 5 brothers in Arundel Cathedral.

Staying near the war memorial, which 'Gentleman of Arundel' is celebrated nearby, what was his name? He was a busy man with lots of jobs! **What were they?**

Looking up at the surrounding buildings can you spot what unusual job **Thomas Walder did?** We bet he was never late for work!

Walk up the hill away from the war memorial and turn left along Tarrant Street. When you can, cross over to the right hand side of the road and keep going.

Keep your eyes peeled for a building guarded by two impressive eagles. Opposite them is a building named after a famous Queen - **but which one?**

Cross back over the road to keep on the pavement. Continue along Tarrant Street until you come to the King's Arms. **They claim to be the, what, in Arundel?**

Turn right at the King's Arms and walk up the hill. When you get to the top you will be on Maltravers Street. Turn right and walk along until you spot a blue plaque celebrating another famous Arundel resident. Who is it and what was their job?

Keep walking along Maltravers Street until you spot some white poles. **Who put them there and when did they do this?** There are two different answers for this question!

Continue along to the end of Maltravers Street, then turn right back onto the High Street. Look out for a narrow passageway between the China Palace and the Town House restaurant. **What sort of person stayed in the building at the end of the alley?**

Walk back down the hill towards the war memorial and cross over to the other side of the road. **Can you spot the Burger Shop? Look at the building - can you see any clue to who worked here before it sold tasty food?**

Keeping on that side of the road, continue walking back towards the roundabout by the bridge. On your way keep your eyes peeled for a sign about Old Harry's Nephew. **What would you take to him to be mended? What does he not give?**
