If you are approaching from the Mill Road Car Park, you will come up the four steps here.







There is an alternative step free access around the side of the Museum, next to Jubilee Gardens. The path is between the stone tables. Follow the ramp round the corner to the museum entrance.







This is the view of the front of the Museum. You enter through the sliding doors which open as you approach. You enter the Foyer of the Museum, which is the reception. You will find a desk to your left where you can speak to a member of the Museum team and buy an entry ticket. Accompanying carers always visit free when a ticket is purchased for the person they are with. To the right of the Foyer is an interactive display which will give you more information about the town of Arundel and its history.





The Museum Shop is on the right-hand side. There are a wide range of gifts and souvenirs available. You can select your purchases here and take them to the reception desk if you wish. Some people like to see this at the beginning or end of their visit. This can also be visited for free without visiting the Museum.





As you enter the Museum exhibitions, you will see a model of the town to your right. We usually suggest you visit in an anti-clockwise direction because it takes you chronologically through the story of Arundel.



There are then exhibits about the Pre-History of the area including fossils. Continue your tour with exhibits on both sides.





Continue your tour until you get to a circular display area to your left. It has an open entrance where you will find more interesting historical information.







At the back lots of children like to try building their own castle! There is also dressing up and children's trails for you to enjoy your visit. Continue around the circular display area. There are further displays about farming and The West Sussex Gazette.



Finally, there are tables and chairs in the foyer. Hot and cold drinks are also available. Toilets are available for Museum visitors.
